1. Curricular Aspects

GDC Ramnagar is committed to providing a comprehensive education framework by offering diverse courses in Sciences, BCA, Commerce, and Social sciences under the CBCS and NEP-2020 framework. Regular curriculum updates ensure alignment with skill development and employability goals. Feedback from students, parents, and faculty drives these updates, fostering inclusivity and relevance.

New courses in Geology, Philosophy and Psychology will cater to evolving academic interests. Skill development and ability enhancement elective courses for Semester III to VI under CBCS and Skill Development, Value Added, Multidisciplinary, Internship Courses along with the Major and Minor Subjects under NEP-2020 will be implemented. There would strategies and plans prepared in consultation with the faculty of the college to incorporate practical components to strengthen hands-on learning. Enhanced ICT facilities with the usage of Interactive Teaching-learning Aids, dedicated browsing platform will further modernize the learning environment.

The college would also strategise along with the faculty and the students to create a more qualitative, conducive and inclusive teaching learning environment as also a thorough mechanism for the evaluation that would enhance the overall growth of the students.

3. Research, Innovation, and Extension

4. Infrastructure and Learning Resources
